National Student Clearinghouse Launches Redesigned Web Site for Recently-Acquired Meteor® Network

The Meteor® Network – a Tool to Access Real-Time Financial Aid Award Information

Herndon, VA., July 28, 2011 – Student financial aid information is more important than ever. Students and institutions need to understand how education dreams are being financed. [The National Student Clearinghouse](#) has a tool providing both students and higher education institutions with a way to make sense of what can often be overwhelming financial aid information -- all in one place.

Acquired in February by the National Student Clearinghouse, the Meteor® Network is a collaborative effort within the student aid industry to simplify and aggregate access to student financial aid award information for both the student and financial aid professional. “Meteor® is a debt management and financial literacy tool, providing both the student and higher education institutions with information about federal and other education aid,” said Timothy Cameron, Meteor Project Manager at the National Student Clearinghouse. Meteor® information includes outstanding federal loans, in addition to billions of dollars in private student loans. Within Meteor®, students and authorized financial aid professionals are presented with a consolidated view of the student’s financial aid obligation, including a summary of the student’s loans and detailed information on awards, repayments, and more. The Clearinghouse is also developing a pilot providing students with information on their state grants and scholarships.

Secure access to Meteor® is available at no cost to students and institutions through the Clearinghouse’s online Student Self-Service suite. State agencies, Guarantors and other student loan providers can also offer their borrowers free access to Meteor® through their Web sites. Visit the new Meteor Network Web site, www.meteornetwork.org, for information on the benefits of the service to students, alumni, schools, and loan holders. A flash-based narrated presentation as well as an online demo, FAQs, and an About Meteor® page provide further detail. The site includes an online contact form that schools and education finance organizations can use to sign up to participate in Meteor® or get more information. Meteor® Network member support is available through its documentation resources and a link to the Member Login site. “The new Meteor Network Web site was designed to emphasize the simplicity and power of Meteor and encourage its use by the higher education and financial aid communities, as a proven way to help students manage their student loan debt”, says Cameron.
